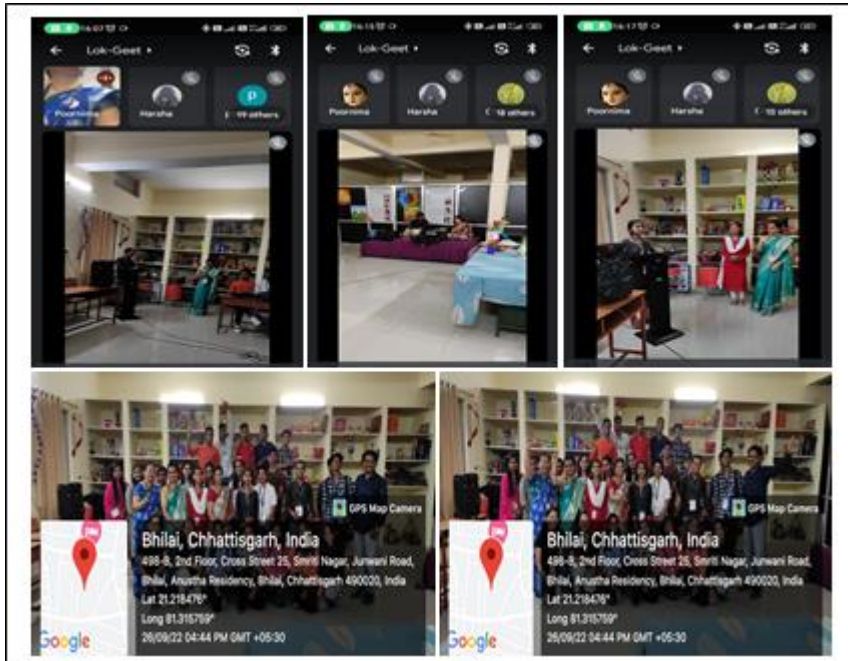
The ancient way of life and customs of this region are introduced through folk songs. The relation of folk songs is mostly based on old traditionsA total of 28 people participated in this program including
